What We Do

Through hundreds of thousands of volunteers, Soldiers' Angels works to ensure that "No Soldier Go Unloved." Projects include care packages, hero "adoption," supplies and gifts of comfort for wounded warriors and veterans, letters and cards of encouragement, handmade comfort items, adaptive technology for the wounded, a music therapy program, support for families of the fallen, employment opportunities for veterans, and much more.

Donors and Donations

Soldiers' Angels is supported entirely by private contributions/grants and item donations from individuals, foundations and businesses; we receive no government funding. Donors may choose to earmark donations for the general fund or for specific projects, which allows 100% of their gift will be used as they direct.

Soldiers' Angels was founded by Patti Patton-Bader, mother of two soldiers and grand-niece of General George S. Patton, and is guided by a Board of Directors. We are Internet-based, relying on a worldwide network of volunteers working through their local communities as well as social and new media outlets such as blogs and forums.

About Us

Soldiers' Angels is a volunteer-led 501(c)(3) non-profit providing aid and comfort to the men and women of the United States Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, and their families. Founded by the mother of two American soldiers, we are an international organization with members in all fifty U.S. states, Puerto Rico, and several friendly countries who support America's men and women in uniform. We were incorporated in the state of Nevada in June of 2003.

Our hundreds of thousands of volunteers in over 20 different teams and programs operate internationally to provide letters, care packages, and comfort items to the deployed, and support for their families here at home. We also provide assistance to the wounded, continuing support for veterans, remembrances and comfort for families of the fallen, and immediate response to unique difficulties that military individuals and families can encounter.

Through special projects, dedicated teams and individuals supporting our troops, we make a visible difference in the lives of our service members and their families. To find out how you can get involved, please visit our website!

Soldiers' Angels began with a self-described ordinary mother of two American soldiers, Patti Patton-Bader. Her eldest son, Staff Sergeant Brandon, deployed to Iraq from 2003-2004 and her youngest was deployed to Iraq from 2007-2008. In the summer of his deployment, Brandon expressed concern that some soldiers in his unit did not receive any mail or support from home. With a mother's love, Patti quickly contacted a handful of friends and extended family, and asked if they would support a soldier or two.

Within just a few months Soldiers' Angels went from a mother sending a few extra care packages and letters, to an Internet community with thousands of Angels worldwide. With more and more merchants donating services, money, and items for packages, we reorganized as a 501(c)(3) non-profit in 2004. Soldiers' Angels currently supports tens of thousands of American military personnel stationed wherever we raise our nation's flag. Our volunteers number in the hundreds of thousands and are led by an all-volunteer Board of Trustees and officers. Today, volunteer "Angels" work around the world to address military-related needs ranging from deployed support to wounded care, remembrance of the fallen, and a wide variety assistance for military families.

Adopting a Soldier

Signing up to adopt a soldier is simple and takes only a few minutes. To begin the process, click on the “join or adopt” link on our website at www.soldiersangels.org.

After you have joined, you will receive an email filled with FAQs and lots of information to help you get started. At this point Soldiers' Angels will also assign you an adopted soldier, and you will receive another email with information about him or her. You can then begin sending your letters and care packages!

While there is no rule on maximum mailing frequency, we require that you commit to sending at least one letter a week and at least one care package a month. You may or may not hear back from your soldier, so do not be disappointed if your soldier does not reply. The troops are very busy (they are in a war zone!), but you can be sure that your letters and care packages are treasured by your soldier! Typical adoptions 5 to 12 months.

This is not a dating service. **We appreciate your desire to support our troops!**

Submitting a Soldier

Soldiers' Angels is a volunteer-led organization dedicated to the active support of our brave men and women in uniform and their families at home. Deployed military personnel of all branches who have not signed up with another adoption group are eligible for adoption through Soldiers' Angels. Adoptees receive cards, letters, and care packages from individual volunteers who have signed up and been verified. If you need additional support, please email us directly.

Adopting Angels do not share their adoptees' address outside of Soldiers' Angels, nor send mail that would be deemed suggestive, inappropriate, or hazardous. Angels provide letters of encouragement and care packages with snacks and hygiene items.

CNCs

Community Network Coordinators (CNCs) are the representatives of Soldiers' Angels in their communities. They are the face of Soldiers' Angels, keeping the needs of our troops in view of their friends and neighbors. CNCs are volunteers, but they hold a special position of leadership in the organization.

CNCs cultivate donations and lead donation drives. For example, they coordinate with local stores to set up a table outside the store to collect things like materials for care packages. They also recruit and coordinate with local Angels, spread the word about Soldiers' Angels within their communities, and help draw their local communities and businesses into special SA events such as the Holiday care package drive or team projects such as Blankets of Hope. In short, CNCs represent Soldiers' Angels to everyone they meet.

Regional Captains and SA State Coordinators oversee and mentor CNCs. This structure also gives CNCs the opportunity for advancement within the organization.

More than anything else, a CNC must be a "people person." CNCs build positive relationships, inspire others to join in troop support activities, and make friends with just about everyone they meet. They must be self-starters and leaders, and have a creative approach to problem-solving.. CNCs must also be registered Soldiers' Angels.

Craft Teams

Operation Top Knot is a nationwide network of service clubs and individuals who sew, knit and shop to create gift baskets for infants and expectant mothers in military families.

Deployments are difficult on the entire family unit, but even more so when that family is expecting or has an infant child. Our mission is to commend the women and children at home for their strength, to let them know we are proud of their sacrifices as well as their husbands' and fathers', and most importantly, to do what we can to support them during the emotionally challenging times of deployment.

Our dedicated volunteers knit, crochet, sew, quilt, and design blankets, booties, hats, onesies, bibs, and many more homemade gifts. We also assemble and deliver gift baskets full of goodies such as bottles, diapers, onesies, pacifiers, washcloths, grooming kits, and more. Additionally, we make sure to remember Dad by sending "It's a Boy!" or "It's a Girl!" bubblegum cigars to wherever he is stationed.

Volunteers can assist Operation Top knot by sewing or knitting/crocheting, shopping for baby items, donating money or materials, and even clipping coupons.

The VA Crochet & Craft Team is part of the Sewing Team. Members make and send lapghans (blankets), hats, scarves, trach/stoma bibs, catheter bag covers, ditty bags, wheelchair/walker totes and slipper socks to VA medical facilities around the country. Members use their sewing, knitting, crocheting and other crafting skills to help provide comfort and dignity to hospitalized veterans while showing them that they are loved and remembered.

*I am sitting here all toasty and warm because someone cared enough to make these booties. I love the lap blanket and booties I was given in the VA hospital. **The idea that someone sat and made those items means the world to me.** Thank you so very much." - Charlotte*

*We had just moved here, and didn't really know anyone around here or have family close by, before my husband left for Iraq. **Opening the mailbox and finding a package from someone you don't know, but cares enough to think about you, is one of the best feelings.** We had a beautiful baby girl, that can't wait till she gets the chance to meet her daddy, hopefully soon. I'm a proud army wife, and very thankful that there are people who can take a stranger and fill their heart with such warmth. - Nikki*

Family Support

Operation Outreach supports the homefront. Deployment isn't just hard on a hero, it's extraordinarily difficult for their family as well. Military families worry, struggle, and sacrifice, and Operation Outreach says "Thank You" to these unsung homefront heroes.

Although our primary request is for cards and letters of support for family members, Operation Outreach also provides gifts to help make a birthday or holiday special, coordinates with Angels in local areas to provide ongoing support, links military families with "e-pals" or pen pals who know what they're going through, and provides limited financial assistance.

Many deployed service members worry a great deal about how their families are going to get along while they're away—they often request items not for themselves, but for their loved ones at home. Operation Outreach works to assure our heroes that while they protect us over there, we are looking out for their families here at home. In addition, OP Outreach works through the Soldiers' Angels Batphone to react quickly to extreme needs or emergency situations that may develop. Living Legends volunteers carry out a very difficult mission for Soldiers' Angels, pay our respects and offer our deepest sympathies to the families and loved ones grieving the painful loss of their son or daughter, spouse, sibling, parent, aunt or uncle, or friend.

This special team sends sympathy cards to families who have lost a loved one to war, reaching out and wrapping them in "Angel Wings." They also offer each family a wreath or a live memorial tree to be planted as a symbol of our deepest sympathies and respect for their fallen hero. The hope is that this tree will grow and flourish, giving the family and friends a living monument to the bravery and heroism of their loved one.

Sewing Teams

The Sewing Team supports the troops through sewing skills. Whether you're an expert or just a casual hobbyist, you can help the Sewing Team meet the needs of our troops through your talent. Current Sewing Team groups are:

Blankets of Hope creates unique, patriotic, handmade blankets to send hope, support and gratitude to America's wounded. Used on hospital beds, wheelchairs, and transport litters on medevac flights, Blankets of Hope bring the message that each service member is loved and not forgotten. You don't have to know how to sew to help Blankets of Hope! Soldiers' Angels has pre-made kits that can be individually decorated, and there are even instructions on our website for no-sew fleece blankets!

Blankets of Belief are created by the same methods as Blankets of Hope (above), but are sent to deployed troops in cold areas to remind them that America says, "We believe in you!" Representative of America's support and belief in their strength, they are a special part of the regular "Wrapped in Holiday Spirit" care packages sent during the winter holidays.

Blankets of Gratitude are crocheted and knitted lap robes delivered to veterans facilities across the country to ensure hospitalized veterans know they that they are remembered, that we are thinking of them, and that we are grateful for their past service. These lap robes are a physical reminder that recipients are not alone. When a veteran receives a Blanket of Gratitude, he or she knows that somebody remembered them, that somebody labored over a handmade robe with thoughts of them and hopes or prayers for their health and comfort.

Patriot Pillow Cases bring hand-sewn cheer and color to what can be a very drab hospital environment in Combat Support Hospitals (CSH) overseas.

Sand Scarves and Cooling Scarves Sand Scarves are used to protect wearers from the elements of the deserts of the Middle East. They keep sand from nostrils and mouth, and when tucked into the shirt, prevent sand from getting inside clothing. The exterior of a Cooling Scarf is cotton, but the magic is in the special "cooling crystals." These scarves lower body temperature by cooling the neck. Through evaporative cooling, they protect the wearer from the effects of extreme heat found in the deserts of the Middle East.

Special Interests

Angel Bakers send specially-made cookies, brownies, and other treats to units identified by Soldiers' Angels as needing extra Angel love. They may have been through an especially difficult experience during their deployment, living in especially trying conditions, or in need of a morale boost for a job well done. Our aim is to show our heroes how much people back home appreciate and care about them.

The Chaplains Support Team was developed with the help of deployed Chaplains and designed to assist their work of providing care, advice and comfort to their troops, as well as ministering to the sick, injured and dying. Chaplains perform most of their duties in a non-denominational capacity, and it is this part of their work that the Soldiers' Angels CST supports.

The chaplains often have very limited resources for their chapels, and many service members have never heard about the compassion and support available from Soldiers' Angels. So, the CST supplies chaplains with requested items related to their mission and a number of small letters and gifts that can be easily distributed to the many service members who seek out their chaplain's assistance. In addition, chaplains have found that setting up small, informal MWR-style facilities gives them a chance to bond with their service members and bring some smiles to their faces, so the CST team often helps stock these facilities.

Some members of the CST represent church groups who want to make sure fellow believers have the support and items needed to practice their religion while deployed. The CST helps these groups connect with those who need that support.

The Ladies of Liberty Team focuses on the needs of deployed female service members, making special efforts to support them and show appreciation for their service. Volunteers on this team provide supplies for women's unique health and hygiene needs, and helps them to experience a few pampered moments of rejuvenation and "being good to themselves." Donations of personal care, pampering, haircare and leisure items are needed.

VA Support

The Veteran Affairs Support Team assists patients at the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs medical centers, nursing homes and Stand Downs. This assistance ranges from visiting patients to providing comfort items and clothing, to sponsoring special events like BBQs or assisting VA facilities with large-scale efforts to improve in-patients' quality of life.

Team members work within their local communities to obtain much-needed funds and items on each VA's "wish list," volunteer for VA events at each facility, and sponsor fundraising efforts for comfort items and big-ticket purchases that facilities may not be able to afford otherwise. The VA Team also reaches out to individual veterans in times of trouble, assisting and supporting them as needed.

Soldiers' Angels is a nationally-recognized VSO (Veterans Service Organization), which means we are included in VA facility meetings, which helps us stay informed on the needs of institutions and their patients.

The VA Support Team has developed the Vet Pack, which is given to the VA facilities to assist regular patients and homeless veterans encountered during Stand Downs (VA events that reach out to homeless veterans, providing medical services, benefits information, clothes, food and a warm shower). You can send a backpack directly to a veteran in urgent need by donating a Vet Pack through www.angelsstore.org.

"Blankets of Belief" form the heart of the *Wrapped in Holiday Spirit* packages. These handmade Blankets are designed to tell America's service men and women, "We believe in you." When deployed service members receive one, they will know that somebody back home remembers them, that somebody labored over a handmade blanket with love and belief in them.

Along with the handmade Blanket, each *Wrapped in Holiday Spirit* care package includes a collection of yummy snacks, a stainless steel travel mug, socks, and a holiday card with a personal note of thanks and support.

Volunteers are always needed to make blankets, donate complete care packages (www.angelsstore.org), or donate package items. For details, please visit the Soldiers' Angels website in the Fall of each year and look for "Wrapped in Holiday Spirit."

*I am stationed in Kabul, Afghanistan, and a group of friends and I just had breakfast in our cafeteria. We had received stockings from the chaplains two nights before, and we opened them today--Christmas morning--together. It **was great to get the gifts and to know you all were thinking of us.** The cards, however, were especially meaningful. Mine is in pencil, in a child's handwriting, addressed "Dear U.S. Solider [sic]" and thanking us for keeping you safe. I think we all had a tear in our eyes as I read it out loud to the group. Wounded Teams

The Wounded TLC Team is comprised of registered Soldiers' Angels who want to make a big difference and lend support during the difficult time when a hero is ill or wounded. Team members send cards and letters of support to service members who are sometimes suffering catastrophic injuries and need to know they are not forgotten. The only commitment is to send a card/letter a week. Individual packages are not sent, but sometimes there are requests for supplies for hospitals or a particular soldier's need.

First Response Backpacks are for injured or wounded military personnel. Treatment and transportation occur with such speed that sometimes their gear and personal items never catch up with them. To address this situation, Soldiers' Angels created backpacks with a full set of travel-sized toiletries and accessories, an international calling card, and a handmade Blanket of Hope. Each backpack also includes clothing that be easily donned by those with serious wounds and give relief from drafty hospital gowns.

First Response Backpacks are one of the first indications wounded or ill soldiers receive that Americans back home are thinking of them, a powerful reminder that they are not alone in the middle of what can be a very traumatic experience . The backpacks are distributed in-country to Combat Support Hospitals and other major facilities that treat or transport the wounded, as well as smaller facilities where a mildly ill/injured soldier might stay for a short while before returning to his or her unit. They are also used at the military hospital in Germany at Landstuhl. At each of these locations, the backpacks enable medical staff to quickly grab an all-in-one pack that meets the basic hygiene needs of patients so that the staff can focus on medical concerns.

Writing Teams

The Cards Plus Team is dedicated to supporting service members, their families, and even other Angels through encouraging cards and notes at special times. Members have to be registered with Soldiers' Angels, and all membership is verified.

Cards Plus events can include anyone of the following, but are not limited to:

The Letter Writing Team is a group of Soldiers' Angels who enjoy writing to service members and who know how important it is for a deployed service member to hear his or her name called at mail call.

Angels on the LWT are assigned names from service members who have been submitted through the Soldiers' Angel website. These soldiers are also assigned an Angel to provide ongoing support, but the LWT Angels provide service members with extra cards and letters.

Angels may sign up for as many days in the week as desired to write to our service members. On each day the Angel has selected, the LWT Team sends them a service member's name and address through www.approvedangels.com. Angels are asked to send only one card or letter to each address assigned, but may send more correspondence to the service member if desired. All service members' addresses are confidential to Soldiers' Angels and only shared with other registered Soldiers' Angels.

Members of the Letter Writing Team must be at least 18 years old.
